

The next workshop date is listed on the WCC calendar.










MYSTERIES OF PHOTOGRAPHY-We see with our brain not our eyes.


Obviously, we need our eyes to detect the presence of light, just like a camera needs some light-sensitive material or device to capture an image. However, what we "see" is not like a digital RAW image file. It is much more like the JPG output where the image information is compressed and a heavily stylised. To illustrate this, look at this image:



Look at the squares labelled A and B. Different shades of grey, right? B is a light square on the checkerboard and A is a dark square. Obvious isn't it?

Why am I showing you this?

Now look at the next image. Here two uniform vertical stripes in the same shade as A have been superimposed on the image. If you open it in any good image editing programme, you can cut out a bar and confirm that it is indeed a uniform grey.



Look at A and confirm they are the same shade as it. Now look down. They are the same shade as B. A and B are identical shades of grey even though we would all swear on the proverbial stack of bibles that they are different.

Impossible? Is it a trick? No.

As the title says, we see with our brains, not with our eyes.

We have to acknowledge Edward H Abelson for the amazing illustrations.

ROBYN WRIGHT

Member: Warragul Camera Club (and Canon Collective on Facebook)

Hi everyone! I'm Robyn and I'm a mad keen amateur photographer from Warragul in Victoria.

I've always loved photography but didn't do anything more than some holiday and family snaps with my old 35mm film Minolta (always on Auto). I was always keen to collect my prints and see how they turned out (and how many didn't!!).

In 2006 my husband and I headed to Canada and the USA on our first overseas trip, so I took the plunge and bought my first Canon DSLR, being the EOS 400D. I teamed this with a Tamron lens and off we went. I was happy with my shots but was still using Auto.



A few years later I did a couple of workshops with one of our local photographers to get off Auto mode. Suffice to say this opened my eyes to a whole new world of photography! I bought myself a Canon 6D and a Canon 'nifty fifty' lens, started shooting mainly in AV mode, and could already see the difference in my images.

I have since acquired a variety of Canon L and non-L lenses (though still love my nifty fifty).

I joined our local camera club 9 years ago (big shout out to Warragul Camera Club) and love being part of the club, with like-minded and enthusiastic people. I submit images to almost all of our monthly competitions and have had some success along the way. I learn lots from the judge's critiques and am now working towards my APS honours.

I currently shoot with a 6DII (especially love that it has an articulating screen), though have been looking lately at moving to mirrorless (have been eyeing off the R6II). I love shooting a variety of genres and love trying out new things. There is always something new to learn! I do love food photography and architecture, and recently have been trying out intentional camera movement. Retiring from my long nursing career last year has been fantastic in giving me lots more time for photography. I have no idea how I had time to work!

Workshop Monday 19th February - Still Life and Food Photography

Photography will be done using

natural light as well as some studio work. Areas covered will include composition and styling, lighting, aperture, where to focus, props and accessories. Advice on lenses and lighting setups to get the best results.

They will be providing props, including food (for photographing!) and whilst they will create some setups there will also be the opportunity for you to create some yourselves.

Items to bring include your camera, tripod (borrow one or share if needed. We will try to have some spares) Lens/s that cover 50mm and/or 100mm.

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
