FIAP Distinctions (Honours)

Please join me in congratulating Jane and David Woodcock, and Michael Moore, on their latest photographic honours from the FIAP (Fédération Internationale de l'Art Photographique, known in Australia as the International Federation of Photography). David and Jane have been awarded the EFIAP/s (or Excellence FIAP Silver) Distinctions and Mike has been awarded the EFIAP (Excellence FIAP) Distinction. This is a wonderful achievement for all, and is no mean feat! These distinctions are awarded to photographers who, along with having excellent techniques, have had significant numbers of their images accepted in many international salons that have FIAP patronage. To be successful Jane, David and Mike have met the following requirements.

Jane and David – EFIAP/s is awarded for at least 300 acceptances, with at least 100 different images, in 10 different countries, plus an additional 5 awarded images in 5 different countries

Mike – EFIAP is awarded for at least 250 acceptances, with at least 50 different images in 10 different countries, plus an additional 2 awarded images from 2 different countries

That is a mammoth effort from Jane, David and Mike as they continue down their Honours pathway.

Members are invited to photograph the Wild Dog Backyard Ultra Marathon at Lardner Park 18 – 20 July. We are not committed to supplying images for the organisers, so it is an individual shoot, not a team effort. You may even capture a potential "Sports Action" shot for the October competition.

The Wild Dog Backyard Ultra is a "Last One Standing" event on the trails of Warragul, Victoria starting at 10 am on Friday 18 July 2025.

Runners tackle a 6.71km loop on the hour, every hour and keep running until they tap out or get timed out. Once all except the last runner fails to complete a lap within cut off, the final competitor must complete a solo lap within cut off to be crowned the winner. If they fail to complete the lap within cut off, they will be a DNF.

The event presents plenty of flexibility for photographers as there is a "start" on the hour every hour, and in between opportunities to shoot at any point around the circuit, day or night.





Mysteries of Photography #17: Diffraction


Photography as we know it depends on use of lenses to focus light on a sensor whether this be chemical sensitivity (silver halide) or a digital medium. In a typical lens, we have light interaction with carefully curved transparent medium. However, to understand what is going on, let's think about a simpler system where we have light interacting with a straight edge.

Here we have a beam of light hitting the edge of a transparent block. The light no longer goes in a completely straight line but bends at an angle at the edge (and at the other edge when it exits the material. What's going on?

Our understanding of this goes back to the 2nd century with Ptolemy of Egypt but a more rigorous derivation had to wait until the 10th century with the Persian mathematician Ibn Sahl.




Ptolemy (left) and an illustration the Ibn Sahl manuscript (right)

Like a lot of ancient knowledge, this was independently rediscovered in the West and is commonly attributed to Willebrord Snellius in the 17th century but this was independently derived and published by René Descartes (below left) although a more correct derivation was published at about the same time by another French mathematician Pierre de Fermat (below right).



Fermat's derivation was based on the speed of light being slower in the denser medium which really is the key to it all.

To understand what's happening without going into the maths, we have to remember light is a wave. When the wave front hits the denser medium at an angle, it slows down compressing the wave front as the light slows. Hence the light beam changes direction.



Remember that light interacting with a straight edge is a special case. When we throw curved surfaces into the mix then it becomes more interesting!


Historic Notes

Now that the last details and finances of the 1984 Warragul National are nearly completed, Camera Club members have voted again_to have the 1985 <u>14th</u> <u>National</u> <u>Exhibition</u>. As I recorded the motion: for the minutes,

I looked around to see who had voted in: favor, and I wondered how many members, beside the regulars who do all the work and preparation each time, would be prepared to fill the extra positions on the National Committee

(all are volunteers), to relieve the burden on those who do the work. This year $I \circ ff e r e d$ to be secretary to help Fay. However, at the time I did not realise how circumstances would create difficulties, making the combination of my 3 positions: General secretary, Newsletter Editor and National Secretary, too much work at one time. Therefore, I would suggest that this year, extra people are needed to fill the position Secretary, Treasurer, and at least 2 Typists to be available to help the Secretary.

I am only prepared to hold one office at one time, so that accordingly, we need more people to volunteer their help, by February for the 1985 Exhibition to go ahead as planned.


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
