As they were also in lockdown, all their programming was based on Skye, and their regular programs exposed us to a lot of the opportunities Skye had to offer, as well as some talented photographers.

Four years later Carol asked me what we should do to mark a 'big birthday' and Skye came to mind. After a few days in Glasgow, and then northern Scotland, we have spent four weeks on Skye, including five days working with Nick Hanson from the Skye Photo Academy (producers of Photography Online). Great tuition and photography tips for us both!

We followed this with a week on Harris and Lewis, and an indulgent trip to the island of St Kilda.

One of the key takeaways from our time working with Nick on landscape photography was the acronym Compose, Focus, Filtration, Exposure... emphasizing the need for these to be considered before pressing the button, ... how many of us consider filters (or tripods) for landscapes? We were also introduced to the app 'Viewfinder' which enables a scene to be previewed at various exposures and focal lengths before selecting a lens for the 'real camera'. If you haven't come across it check it out.

#### Mysteries of Photography #4: Edge Perception


Take any graphics program and make a series of squares (no outlines) and fill with a series of uniform grey fills of 100% to 10%. (No point in making a 0% grey. That is the same as the white background.)

A strange thing happens if we push them together.



Suddenly the uniform grey fills no longer appear uniform! Take your colour picker and they are still uniform, but they appear lighter on the left and darker on the right (adjacent to the lighter square).

This is not just the case with grey fills. Take 10% increments from 0 to 255 (Adobe RGB color space) for red, green and blue and you see a similar apparent non-uniformity. To my "eyes", there is a more pronounced edge effect with green with the least apparent effect with blue. Is it the same with you?



If you read the earlier editions of the Mysteries of Photography, this is just another case of us seeing with our brains, not with our eyes. However, what does this mean for photographic images – how we perceive them and how we process them optimally?

Our brains are looking for edges. Should we further emphasize them and will this enhance the appearance of our images? There are macros available for Photoshop and Affinity Photo that specifically emphasize this edge effect. (The Classic clarity slider option in CaptureOne also does this as well but interestingly the other three clarity options do not to anything like the same extent.)

The fact that skilled users of Photoshop and Affinity have gone to all the effort of constructing complex macros to exaggerate this edge effect suggests that many experts in image processing consider that its use will enhance the attractiveness of their images. Personally, I like to use it with greyscale images (CaptureOne Classic clarity) but not with colour images.

However, like everything in aesthetics it is totally personal.

#### A LITTLE BIT OF HISTORY.


I was going back through my huge accumulation of historic old camera club files the other day and I found this and thought you might be interested in seeing it. I do feel the history of your club is very important to maintain.

For some years in the past the Australian Photographic Society (APS) gave recognition to camera clubs who ran Nationals for the best catalogue. Our club won this award on a number of occasions.

Our catalogues for many years used to be published by Drouin Commercial Printers. The selection of images chosen to go into the catalogue in those days was very important taking into consideration whether they would print up ok, we used to try and avoid lots of blacks as that would simply loose any detail.

Now days it's all digital and reproduction is much more tolerant, (no reflection on Drouin Commercial Printers they did a fantastic job) the process of laying out the design is done by one of our sponsors Home Grown Design in Drouin, we supply them with the information from our data base and include a selection images and they do the designing, then they send it off to their printers.


I am proud to say our catalogues each year are of a very high standard and are valued by our entrants. Ruth Burleigh (historian)





### "Behind the Seen" FREE e-Book

## A great way to take your photography to the next level



I thought you might be interested in a new photography e-book I have been made aware of called "Behind the Seen" or "The Psychology of Imagery" by Adrian Lowe.

I have spent a while talking to Adrian, who lives in Queensland, and we clicked well, especially discussing how we can take our photography past the mundane and usual captures we shoot for competitions etc.

Adrian's bio is very impressive, and he certainty has a lot to offer in the world of photography especially if you want to extend your photography creativity.

Adrian's first job was in a camera store, then with 2 retail stores of his own, a mini lab, darkroom, professional and commercial work, obligatory weddings for years, projects, commissions, curating and personal exhibitions, 25 years of psychology practice and philosophy tutor, with photography lectures, workshops, judging, and mentoring.

This book is more about looking behind the automatic/subconscious reasons we get attracted to scenes so we can shoot and edit to highlight those important things. It also means viewers will automatically/subconsciously see what we are trying to show.

It's in fairly plain language and is quite comprehensive at 333 pages and at **no cost**. Check it out. It's explained quite well with examples of articles at: <a href="https://sites.google.com/view/behindtheseen">https://sites.google.com/view/behindtheseen</a>

Once you enter his website, you get a bit of an intro of the book with an invitation to register and receive a free download of the book. From what I've read so far it has a lot of good inspirational information that will help you get out of the "photography rut" that we all find ourselves in at some time.
