

#### Moving to the VRI

Our August competition night (August 4) will be the first event at the VRI / Bbaa ArtSpace at 128 Queen Street in Warragul.

# Camera club earns champion title

The Warragul Camera Club was recently named the "Champion Club" at the 2025 Gippsland Interclub Photography Exhibition.

The award was presented at the Latrobe Regional Gallery in Morwell on Friday, July 12 as part of the gallery's winter exhibition season opening event.

The Interclub Photography Exhibition features 60 images taken by members of Gippsland's six community photography clubs. All images in the exhibition were taken in Gippsland and showcase diverse depictions of the urban, rural and coastal and communities of Gippsland.

A panel of three independent and highly credited photography judges - John Ansell, Tuck Leong and Michael Walker - awarded prizes for the best print and best club in the exhibition.

Warragul Camera Club received the highest point score of the six clubs involved in the competition and its name was added to the perpetual Gippsland Interclub Photography Competition banner.

Contributing to the club's overall score were David Woodcock's winning image, Ruth Burleigh's third placed image and Jane Woodcock's merit award winning image.

The complete Gippsland Interclub Photography Exhibition can be viewed at Latrobe Regional Gallery until Sunday September 21. The gallery is open seven days a week, from 10am to 4pm.


## Warragul Camera Club is well represented in Awards of International Photographic Honours

The Federation International de l'Arte Photographic (FIAP) is the premier international organisation for amateur photographers and is the only one affiliated with UNESCO. Photographers participating in international competitions endorsed by FIAP can apply for a graduated set of Honours based on their success in these international competitions.

On Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> July, the annual FIAP award ceremony was held online with awards presented by a member of the FIAP secretariat, Luis Franke, with Bronwen Casey, APS liaison officer for FIAP officiating. There was a total of 30 Australian recipients this year for FIAP awards including 3 from the Warragul Camera Club.

Mike Moore was presented with his EFIAP while Jane and David Woodcock each received a Silver bar to add to their EFIAPs.

It is amazing that such a small country club could make up 10% of those receiving recognition for their success in international competitions!

#### Judge...Bob Thomas LAPJA

I have been an active member of several Victorian Camera Clubs since 2006 including Eastern Suburbs, Camberwell, Melbourne Camera Club and currently Waverley Camera Club.

During the intervening years I have occupied a variety of roles including secretary, webmaster, newsletter editor, computer operator and presenter. I have also run a variety of internal and external photographic training courses and written numerous newsletter articles on the subject. Externally, I taught photography at the University of the Third Age, presented lectures to libraries and community houses and mentored new photographers as they began their own photographic journeys.

Competitively, I have won many club photographic competitions and awards over the last 17 years and have participated on numerous panels and judging committees. I was awarded the VAPS Meritorious Service Award in 2020. Specialising for a while in Audio Visual productions, my AVs have won first place at VAPS three times as an individual and once as part of a team. In 2009 I won the 2009 APS National AV "Champion of Exhibition" plus many other AV awards. One of my primary interests lies in creative images and compositing.

Since 2017 I have regularly judged digital and print competitions for clubs in Victoria and other state competitions plus internationally as required. I have judged the annual VAPS AV competitions on many occasions. I also judge for photographic groups outside the VAPS affiliated group of camera clubs. Due to health problems and voice projection issues I no longer judge "live" competitions, but provide comprehensive written assessments remotely.

My overall philosophy is that images and audio visuals should always generate an emotion in the mind of the viewer, provided that the emotion is not one of apathy or indifference. A picture is worth a thousand words, preferably engaging ones, and a good image or AV should draw the viewer back looking for more.

Last our small group meandered down the Tarra Valley, back out of the fog and mist to a cold but sunny afternoon in Yarram for a late lunch at the Bakery.






#### **July Workshop on Atmospheric Effects**

#### The Andrew Rovenko "Look"

During Covid when we were severely restricted in our movements, Andrew Rovenko and his daughter together began to create a series of images, "The Rocket Girl Chronicles". These have been extraordinarily successful with exhibitions and awards all over the world.


Part of their success is the use of an unworldly colour palette. One example from his web site (<a href="https://rovenko.com">https://rovenko.com</a>) is shown below: "The Reception", chosen here because it has large areas of grass and sky when we all know where the "normal" colours would look like. At the recent VAPS conference in Castlemaine, Andrew presented a fascinating talk on his work and was totally open about how he achieved the "unworldly" look to his images. The essence of it was his use of a medium format camera with negative film that he deliberately overexposed.

Now you ask why would he do that? Unlike digital sensors where response is essentially linear until they cut out at top and bottom, the response of silver halide emulsion on film is more a sigmoidal function.



It has a linear response in the middle but tails off for a long time at the top and bottom. This means that, if you overexpose film, you have some detail retained in the overexposed regions, not a sudden cut off that you see with digital.

Now can we mimic film in our digital images? *Firstly, do not try this with a JPG*. They are only 8 bit images with no long heads or tails for use to play with. Start with a 14 (or 16) bit RAW image with a wide range of light intensity and construct an artificial response curve that is the **opposite** of sigmoidal curve (i.e. shallow

but linear in the middle and with a steep response at the top and bottom ends of the range. Now we apply this to an image with lots of green grass and blue sky.

Now I am not suggesting you apply weird tonal response curves to your images for club (or interclub) competitions. Nor am I suggesting that I have exactly reproduced the Andrew Rovenko "look" in one simple experiment. However, at some stage in your photographic journey you may want to experiment with making your images less representative, more "artistic", rather than be confined by the standard amateur photographic aesthetic.

Like medieval monks, you may decide that an essential part of this is to don the proverbial "hair shirt" and dust off that old medium format SLR and start using roll film again. Certainly there is undeniably an ample measure of nostalgia and romance associated with older technologies. Alternatively, you might like to explore the powerful tools you already have hiding in plain sight on your desktop.

Note: The old SLR shown here is available for loan. It has an f/3.5 105mm lens (Musachino Koki) and comes with two different backs for 120 roll film allowing 8 or 12 images per roll. Dusty but fully functional.


