B GRADE PRINTS

Beginning with the February "Open" competition all Grade B Print entries must be printed on A4 photo paper and not mounted.

You may submit a borderless print, but a small margin is recommended. If your image is cropped to an aspect ratio other than A4 it should be printed to fit either the full width or height of the A4 page as appropriate. Do not trim off any excess paper, leave it the full A4 size.

Because the print will not have the protection of a mat board separating it from other prints in transport, great care must be taken to avoid damaging another print when they are stacked together. Do not use any kind of sticky tape to attach the label with the print details. You should only use good quality mailing labels. You should enter your club membership number on each label then print it on your "print and peel" mailing labels. The Date, Competition and Title are filled out by hand as required and attached to the back of your print in **top LH corner**.

The Workshop on 17th February will be designed to get you started on printing. Russell Monson and David Woodcock will demonstrate how to prepare your image for printing and have them printed for you on a standard A4 office printer.

Car Parking is available at the market at reasonable rates if you would prefer to drive.





Mysteries of Photography #12: Is sRGB all that bad?

In Mysteries #11, I discussed the origins and limitations of the common colorspace standards common in photography, sRGB and Adobe RGB.

Just to remind you, this diagram represents the limits of human colour perception and the range of colours encompassed by these two colorspaces. sRGB is in green and Adobe RGB in red.




Both cover only part of what we can perceive with sRGB being significantly smaller than Adobe RGB. But, in the real world of photography, is the sRGB colorspace all that bad?



Let's take this highly coloured image that was shot in RAW¹ and exported as Adobe RGB and see how its components go in sRGB.

I have used Colorthink2 to compare the colours covered by sRGB with the colours in individual pixels in this Adobe RGB image using a 2D graph. Any pixels outside sRGB colorspace shown as the dots outside the coloured sRGB triangle.



There is a little bit of a spatter of red dots outside sRGB outline but surprisingly little. (Also some blue from the jewels in the head dress.)

Also remember if I had processed this image to the sRGB colorspace, the colours would have been compressed to fit within sRGB and there should be no out of gamut colours in the exported image.

So maybe sRGB isn't that bad after all. Console yourself with that thought when you export your RAW images into sRGB for competitions. Trying to sneak in images in Adobe RGB (with colours that are out of gamut in sRGB) into a competition that specifies sRGB is extremely unlikely to give you an advantage and may result in your images looking worse than if you exported them in sRGB.

¹ This image was shot using a Sony a7R3. The colorspace of this camera sensor is very much in excess of Adobe RGB and, in green, actually extends beyond the limits of human perception. Graph available on request.


