
President's Report May 2022





Ron Cork - Biography (February 2022)

- Started interest in photography in 1972 but not taken seriously until 1998.
- Joined Knox Photographic Society in October 2000 and began submitting prints to competition immediately.
- I have been judging since 2005.
- My current APJA judge accreditation is at Associate or Level 4.
- I was a committee member of the APJA for a number of years and I edit all the video training sessions to make them presentable for the website..
- I have been using Photoshop since version 4 (1997) and had been using other graphic packages such as ACAD and Corel Draw soon after they were introduced in the early 1980's. I currently use CS5 and never had a need to upgrade further. I use and love the NIK Collection.
- My early interest was for landscapes and travel but I also enjoyed street and candid photography and still do and worked as a professional for about 7 years including portrait sessions in my own studio. I am one of the rare people who liked shooting weddings because of the candid 'street' photography spontaneity feel of it..
- I expanded my range to studio and environmental portraits but travel is a big favourite. I have been lucky enough to be able to travel extensively both around Australia and have visited many countries.
- I am a true believer in camera clubs, for the knowledge sharing, mentoring, image assessments and competitions for the judge's critiques and comments. I love the exposure to the wide variety of great images and styles you get, both as a member and a visiting judge.
- I love judging for a few reasons, mainly because it was from judge's comments and criticisms that I developed as a photographer. Also because it exposes me to so much great (and some not so great) photography and it keeps me grounded.
- I also love giving seminars and workshops and a multitude of topics including making AV's. They allow me to get amongst other club people, enjoy their company and also it allows me to give back something, to teach others what I have learned. I believe in giving my honest opinions, both the good and bad and exposing photographers to what they are doing wrong as well as right. You need to know what it is you don't know in order to learn how to do it correctly. I love the opportunity digital images give me in club image assessment events as I can use Photoshop and NIK to make appropriate changes in them to demonstrate visually what it is I talk about in a presentation, where this is allowed.
- I am one of the small band of judges able to travel to rural clubs for seminars, workshops and assessments.
- I never used to have a particular style but since NIK came along there are now styles I gravitate to. I like all styles of shooting and image making. I have fun shooting what I see and with the different Photoshop tools and like exploring what they do.
- I enjoy seeing good results from creative thinking and really like to see the 'art' more than the technical craft of photography.
- I am also a musician (electric bass) and sound engineer and over my 60 years at it have worked with most of the top Australian names and many visiting overseas artists and bands, both as a musician on stage and TV and at the sound mixing console in live gigs.
- I got interested in woodworking recently and have built a home workshop.
- I am heading up to 78 this coming July and am still loving life and photography.






