A BIG THANK YOU to all members who assisted at the Hallora Marathon.

Hallora Marathon Photoshoot.

For the third year in a row Warragul Camera Club has provided a team of photographers to cover the Hallora Marathon and provide a record of the event plus an opportunity to contribute to the funds raised for the Peter Mac Cancer Research Centre through photo sales.

With a record number of 930 signed up online (though some didn't turn up) there must have been close to 900 runners, which was huge. The amount raised as of 18th (19th

December) stands at \$58,000. A new record amount!

The club photography team consisted of 9 members: Lynne Farrely, Thomas Gruber, Robyn Rosenboom, Mike Moore, Geoff Smith, Garry Smith, Bruce Langdon, Russell Monson and Des Lowe.

Des, Thomas and Russell covered the early Hallora start and Main South Road. Robyn, Lynne, and Mike covered the section in Civic Park, Drouin. Bruce, Gary and Geoff covered the starts of the shorter events and the finish line for all in Western Park, Warragul.

The team's task didn't end with capturing the images of course, there followed a significant number of hours of culling, processing and exporting. Even though the brief was to do the minimum amount of work in post, between us it still added up to quite a few hours' work. In the end 5,283 photos were uploaded to Geo Snapshot ready for sale. There have already been over 230 photos sales.as I write.

Thankyou team for a great effort which is appreciated by the committee as a significant positive promotion for the club in the general community. It is also highly regarded and much appreciated by the Marathon organisers, and not least of all by the participants in the event.



Affinity is now Free (but there are some gotchas!)

A European company, Serif, has sold its products to Canva, a US company. This included the notable Affinity Photo. Despite being sold retail for a surprisingly small sum (\$49 on the Microsoft Store), Affinity Photo is widely considered to be a superior alternative to Adobe Photoshop. (Dr Les Walkling, a Photoshop ambassador for many years, told me he considered Affinity Photo to be what he always wanted Photoshop to become but hadn't.)


With the Canva purchase, the Affinity suite (Designer, Photo and Publisher) are all now free. The Photo "persona" is now called Pixel in the Canva version.

Canva wants to make its money by hooking customers on the Affinity suite and then on-selling their Al addons to work with it.

I have used the original Serif Affinity Photo for several years, mainly for its very capable in-built focus stacking and panorama functions plus the odd bit of creative manipulation.

The Canva version looks very similar but the new owners seemed to have felt the need to put their stamp on it and, unfortunately, these changes are not actual improvements.

The original Affinity Photo is on the right and the Canva Affinity in Pixel (Photo) on the left.



On the left of the interface (red boxes), Canva have removed the colour from the icons making them harder to distinguish, in my opinion. On the right (yellow circle), they have rearranged the icons for no good reason that I can see other than to make it theirs.

Also, Canva seems to be monitoring everything you do with the Affinity suite. I received this email. Are they using your work to train their AI, I wonder?

Remember, if something is free, you are the product.

With all that said, Affinity Photo/Pixel is still a very capable and useful bit of software well worth considering by serious photographers.


